A Message From Our President

CONVENTIONS

In June, we closed out the 2014 – 2016 Biennium with our convention "The Living Word". This theme was chosen because those who do not know God's Son need to be told about Jesus and it starts by telling them about the Holy Word and our amazing Savior. Furthermore, all children of God need to continue in His Word. A great deal of praying, planning and work went into the convention by very many people. In many ways, it was a successful convention. In some other ways, it was disappointing.

Conventions are held to conduct the business of the district. At convention, we choose a Mission Goal, decide which missions we want to support with our mites, make changes to our Bylaws and elect district officers. Those matters of business must be done. Bible study and missions (grants and service) are important to the LWML, and these are included in the convention. Christian fellowship is automatic and wonderful whenever a group of LWML members get together.

All members of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League can be represented by its society delegates. Each society has the opportunity to have a delegate at the convention. The delegate represents them, and votes for them. Each convention, we have fewer societies with delegates. Those women and societies have no voice and miss out on the great Bible studies and mission inspiration. That is disappointing.

When planning a convention, we do not want to waste any attendee's time. We strive for excellent Bible studies, and try to have mission speakers that will bring new mission insights and opportunities to all. The Bible studies and mission speakers help us learn to better share Jesus' story with those who have not heard about our Savior. At the same time, we try to practice good stewardship with your money and the LWML's money.

That said; there are some things that have to be considered. We look for a venue that is close to the center of the district. We need an auditorium that will hold about 400. We need a separate place for meals to use time prudently. We need many smaller rooms. These rooms are for luncheons, displays, counting ballots and money, a place for a good-sized ingathering, etc. We need a convenient registration area. We do take into consideration that many attendees cannot walk great distances, so the whole area needs to be compact.

I realize that the cost of attending the convention continues to rise. That happens as attendance falls, and costs rise. We do not have as many sharing the cost of a convention. Some items we cannot change. An LWML (National) representative comes to every convention. Some organizations have helped pay for some convention extras, and do get to have someone speak. The cost of meals and

“While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease.” Genesis 8:22

The cycle of seasons is one of those subtle blessings of God that is such a part of our lives that we take it for granted. What a comfort that should be in a world of natural disasters, terrorist attacks, and unpredictable election campaigns.

MITE GOAL SET AT CONVENTION

The delegates and voting members of the LMWL Minnesota South District chose thirteen projects to support with the Mite donations for the 2016-2018 biennium. The total Mission Goal was set at \$265,000! Let us "Serve The Lord with Gladness" as we collect our mites for these projects.

PARLIAMENTARY PAUSE

BYLAWS AND PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE IN THE LOCAL SOCIETY



Bylaws are a very important part of the LWML. The national LWML and its 40 districts need to have the structure of bylaws to maintain the mission and integrity of the organization. Bylaws take on another meaning at the society level. Each society writes its own bylaws and the only requirements are the articles on object, membership, and parliamentary authority which must confirm to the national bylaws.

The structure of Parliamentary procedure almost disappears in the small society. You can make motions or speak without asking for formal recognition, you do not need to have a second and it's not unusual to speak as often as necessary to get your point across. You can discuss issues without a motion on the floor and the president can even make motions, participate in the discussion or vote.

And what does this mean: when it comes to the society level, yes, you need the bylaws to keep the overall focus and purpose of your organization clear, but you can let up on the formal parliamentary rules and do what suits your organization best. Whether you go right or left the end is the same: Mission, Ministry and Mites.
