In God We Believe and Trust!



Above all of this, the ladies of LWML Minnesota South responded to the need and generously gave above and beyond their usual giving.

THE GOSPEL OF CHRIST

Good News!

The Christian Church is based solidly on the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. And the Lutheran Church is also founded on that Gospel. In fact, probably many of our churches have the word “evangelical” as a part of their title. (For example, Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church.) Do you know what that word “evangelical” means? It means that this church teaches the good news of the gospel.

Now not everyone knows the gospel, or even what the gospel is. Before our junior confirmands are confirmed, we have a Witness Sunday at church where they are asked several questions by the pastor. One of the questions I always ask each year is: “What is

the gospel?” The answer I expect is this: “The gospel is the good news of God’s love, forgiveness, and salvation in Jesus Christ.”

So the gospel is all about what God does for us. It is not about what we do for God or others. That would classify as law, and the law saves no one.

In I Corinthians 15, the great resurrection chapter of the Bible, St. Paul begins with these important words.

Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He appeared to Cephas and then to the Twelve. I Corinthians 15:1-5

Notice the two key parts of the gospel that Paul proclaimed: Christ died for our sins and was raised on the third day. He did this to save us.

I’m confident that you know there are four Gospels that tell us the story of Jesus and His love, namely Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. I trust you also know that passage from John 3:16 that is often referred to as “the gospel in a nutshell.” *For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.*

Again, note how this gospel shares what God has done for us. God loved us and gave us His Son. We celebrate that at Christmas. And God’s Son Jesus loved us and gave His life for us. We celebrate that each Good Friday and every time we receive the body and blood of Jesus in Holy Communion. And in the Easter season, we celebrate the fact that our Lord Jesus is risen triumphant from the grave and He lives eternally to save. In these loving acts of our God we find forgiveness, freedom, peace, salvation, and joy.

Our Convention Theme this summer was to have been, “Tell Everyone What He Has Done” based on Isaiah 12:5: *Sing praise to the Lord; for He has done gloriously; let this be made known to all the earth.* In response to God’s great love for us, we are compelled to make known His marvelous deeds (the gospel).

I have long treasured the great commission at the end of Mark’s Gospel. We read these words in Mark 16:15-16. Jesus said to them, “Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. *Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved.*” The book of Acts is all about the early missionaries of the Church who told the message of Christ crucified for us and risen again to all who would listen.

This is the mission of the Christian Church. This is the mission of the Lutheran Church. This is the mission of the LWML. This is my mission and yours.

And what better and more needed news could we give to our broken, hurting world? *He has done it!* (Psalm 22:31)

A Quorum - - What is it & What's it for?



What is it? The minimum number of voting members required to be present at a properly called meeting in order to conduct business for your group is called a *quorum*.

What's it for? A quorum is intended to keep too few members from making important decisions for your group. In effect, it protects the many from the decisions of the too few!

If you say something like 'any members present can be a quorum,' then you could be allowing as few as two members to get together for your meeting and make decisions for your group!

What happens if you set a quorum and then not enough people show up? You can still...

Fix the time to adjourn. If you make it for later in the day, maybe you can call some additional members and "remind" them to come to the meeting now.

Adjourn. You can end this meeting and wait for the next regular meeting.

Recess. Take a short break. Maybe some of the members had to leave the meeting to check on the kids or take a bio break. Wait for them to come back before voting on a motion!

Take other measures to assemble a quorum. Maybe you can have your speaker go ahead with his/her talk while you make some calls to have more members come to the meeting – enough so that you have a quorum.

Go ahead with your speaker or program. You do not need a quorum if you are not going to conduct any group business.

One more thought about a quorum...if you do not have any quorum mentioned in your bylaws, then Robert's Rules of Order sets your quorum as 50% of your members! For example, if you have 70 members (including honorary ones), you would need at least 35 members present to conduct business.

The ministry provides them with housing, jobs, referrals to treatment, welcoming congregations, etc. Until they receive their first paycheck, they do have some needs. And now, many have been furloughed from their jobs.

VERY IMPORTANT UPDATES: As we know, the COVID-19 has certainly changed everyone's lives and how we go about our everyday living. As such, we are adapting to the changing needs of the Correctional Ministry by adding the Hygiene Kits listed below. All items listed are **needed now**. We will be collecting:

- Bibles – NT will be provided by the Gideons
- Used (clean/good condition) backpacks, duffle bags or soft-sided luggage (logos on them are fine). Sorry, no LWML convention bags.
- Tide Pods
- Socks – men /women's tube or crew socks (black or white)
- Food: **complete meal, non-perishable items**, for example Soup, SpaghettiO-type meals, Chili, Ramen Noodles, etc. Also, Peanut Butter, Jelly, or other shelf-stable items.
